Snap Elections in Turkey: The Last Exit Before Illegal Legality

Following months of speculation about possible early elections, on April 16, 2018, the anniversary of the controversial 2017 referendum, Devlet Bahceli, the leader of the Nationalist Action Party (MHP), called for early elections to be held on August 26, the national holiday. On April 18, the State of Emergency was extended for the seventh time. A few hours later, Bahceli and President Recep Tayyip Erdogan met and announced that snap elections would be held on June 24.

Following the April 18 announcement of the decision to hold early elections, on April 24 the Monitoring Committee of the Council of Europe's Parliamentary Assembly (PACE) recommended that Turkey should postpone the elections. PACE argued that 'the legitimacy of the elections was at stake' for many reasons.

THE FINAL TEST FOR TURKISH DEMOCRACY

However, Sultan Abdulhamid the II. closed the parliament after 18 months, citing the Ottoman-Russian war, and suspended the constitution. From that period until today, Turkish democratic march has always been exposed to intermittent tides. This time in 1908 II. CIVIL ISLAM AND EUROPE

All Abrahamic religions first established themselves as civil engagement and developed over time either merely civilly or civilly and politically. The length of time Judaism, Christianity and Islam required to establish themselves differed. Judaism needed only one generation in order to establish itself in Jerusalem under the leadership of Joshua. Christianity, a civil religion, only became politicized 300 years after its creation.
